## TB advisory service expands to include camelids

Some may be aware that the TB advisory service (TBAS), aiming to deliver bespoke biosecurity advice to cattle farmers in England, has now been expanded to include keepers of other TB susceptible species such as sheep, pigs, goats and camelids. Not only that, but the service is also to be offered in 'low risk' areas of the country. It should come as welcome news that with an appointment of a camelid vet to the TBAS Technical Board, the interests of camelid health and welfare are being represented at a high level. Input from several different veterinary groups (including VetPartners and IVC Evidensia) and a consortium of independent practices means that keeper's own vets will have the opportunity to train as a TBAS advisor, in the knowledge that the materials have been designed with camelid ownership (both hobby and commercial) in mind.

TBAS aims to empower keepers to identify areas where biosecurity measures can be put in place, or enhanced, to reduce the risk of TB on the holding. This is achieved with two visits from a trained veterinary advisor (free of charge), where areas for improvement can be identified, prioritised and advice tailored to the holding. In what has been a tumultuous year for camelid keepers, it is hoped that due attention will be given to preventative measures, risk-management, and contingency planning, alongside an empathetic vet who understands the species and industry. This is a huge opportunity to gather information about what the camelid community already employs in terms of biosecurity, and how well the threat and control of TB is understood, so it would be wonderful if we could all engage with it. Having a seat at the table means that control and eradication of this disease could be within reach.

Camelid owners with a CPH number will be able to access these services free of charge soon, so please keep an eye on the TBAS website <a href="https://www.tbas.org.uk/">https://www.tbas.org.uk/</a> and register your interest, and if your vet may be interested in training an adviser, please encourage them to get in touch too.

## **Information Update**

#### **Entries**

The entry system will open for new bookings at 9am on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2021 and remain open for one week, closing at 9am on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2021.

Minimum entry 3 alpacas, maximum 25. Any entries paid and held over from last year are safe and protected. Herds with existing entries from last year may request any additional places at this time. If bookings are oversubscribed, any reduction will be made from this year's entries only. Progeny classes will not be taken into consideration when reviewing entry numbers.

Named entries will need to be made between 1<sup>st</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Feb 2022 using the Show Entries tab on the Pedigree Registry section on the BAS website. Progeny classes must also be entered at this time if they are to be included in the Show Catalogue, but male progeny groups can still be entered up to 12 noon on the Saturday of the Show.

### At the show

Doors open for arrivals at 9am on Friday, and all exhibitors must be in the halls before 12 noon Friday 25 March.

The Show Halls will **not** be available to overnight alpacas on the Sunday. To facilitate early departure on Sunday, halter judging will start at 3.30pm on Friday following the exhibitor's briefing at 3pm. Judging on Saturday and Sunday will be starting at 8am both days.

The timetable for classes will be confirmed following review of entry numbers.

All alpacas must remain in the show until final judging has finished.

The fleece show judging will take place in February by Mary-Jo Smith, and winning entries displayed throughout the National Show.

### **Auctions**

### Stud auction

The popular Stud Auction will take place over 4 weeks in February, opening on 31 January and closing on Sunday 5 March.

### Alpaca Live Auction

On the Saturday night following the dinner there will be a Live Alpaca Auction which will include 5 outstanding alpacas selected by the Show Organisers from member's submissions. A further 3 'wild card' alpacas will be included. Sale animals will be on view in the owners' pens during Friday and Saturday.

Lot numbers and details of sale conditions will be published in the catalogue.

### Social events

There will be an informal "Meet and Greet" on Friday evening, from 6.30 pm. Drinks and snacks will be available with a friendly request for any donations to be made in the hospice bucket.

It is hoped that exhibitors will join a buffet style dinner in the TIC which will be followed by the live alpaca auction on the Saturday night of the show. . More details to follow and booking.

# **December Husbandry**

### December

- Stop matings to avoid November births.
- Feed hay ad lib, feed pregnant and nursing dams extra protein.
- Body score, check jaws, teeth and toenails, look for evidence of mites.
- Cria need to be vaccinated against clostridial disease.
- Wean and insert microchips in cria who are now 6 months old and get them logged onto the registry via 'Manage your Herd' in the on line herd book or by asking the registry office to send you a paper application form . registry@bas-uk.com
- Consider giving an Autumn drench of zinc, copper, cobalt selenium, B12.
- Cut field hedges
- Confirm breeding programme for next year. aiming for spring and summer births




# **Young Members Zoom Call**

COVID restrictions impacted the Scottish Show, just as they did many more over the past two years; so, we aim to come back stronger than ever in 2022.


